Covid-19 Outbreak Prevention Plan 2020 (COPP)

Sydney Ski Club (SSC) has implemented a Covid-19 Outbreak Prevention Plan (COPP), to promote a safe and healthy environment for all our members, guests, caretakers and trades. This is a guide for preventing and responding to any outbreak of illness whilst staying at either SSC lodge in Perisher or Thredbo.

Our lodge caretakers will assist in monitoring this important area of health on your arrival and throughout your stay, the purpose being for the safety of all members and their guests. However, as our caretakers are not permanently on premise it is crucial that members assist with a responsible and calm approach in managing the situation.

Our plan is designed to first prevent outbreaks from occurring and then to halt the spread if one develops.

By staying at the SSC, you agree and have a personal responsibility and duty of care for those around you. You are also bound by the Waiver Liability which must be signed as a condition of staying at the Club.

Health and Safety:

SSC directors and caretakers will take all reasonable steps to promote a safe and healthy environment for all. It is the responsibility of members and their guests to be transparent and disclose any known risks, existing or current health conditions. As a result of a known or disclosed infectious pathogen or medical condition, the SSC directors and caretakers may request medical clearance from your doctor prior to your booking being approved. Medical clearance must be completed by your treating doctor on determination that there is no risk/safe to stay in a shared-space ski lodge with limited natural airflow and knowledge there will be contact/close proximity to a range of persons from a newborn to the elderly. Any assessment or appointment with your treating doctor is at your expense. The SSC directors and caretakers and its directors reserve the right to deny entry or accommodation services should we considered that it is not in the best interest of the SSC members and their guest.

Cleaning:

Our cleaning regime includes cleaning all surfaces with anti-bacterial cleaners. All bed sheets are washed in each change over. An anti-bacterial spray is used in each apartment during the cleaning change over each week. We have made available anti-bacterial hand sanitisers and surface cleaners. It is imperative that members and guest clean all surfaces with the provided surface cleaners throughout their stay.

Sickness and Outbreak:

If you develop respiratory symptoms including flu like symptoms, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath or breathing difficulties or gastrointestinal illness, you should

- seek medical advice at the medical centre. You can also contact the health direct helpline 1800 022 222 for information regarding testing and medical advice.
- isolate yourself in your room until you are provided with an all clear from the medical centre
- advise the caretakers via text or email of your situation

We will advise other members and assist in ensuring you have adequate supplies while you are isolated.

In the instance of an outbreak, we will be guided by current medical and Health NSW guidelines as to the most appropriate action which may include quarantining the club. The SSC directors and caretakers reserve the right to ask you to leave should we consider that it is not in the best interest of the SSC to have you remain at the club. Your remaining accommodation services would therefore not be refundable. It is suggested to take out travel insurance prior to making your booking.

Practice good hygiene to protect against infections. Good hygiene includes:

- wash your hands for at least 20 seconds with soap and water or use an alcohol-based sanitiser with at least 60% alcohol
- cover your nose and mouth when you sneeze or cough with your elbow or tissue and wash your hands again
- avoid close contact with people who are ill
- avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth

- stay home or if at the SSC, isolated if you are sick and suffering sore throat, fever or respiratory issues and seek medical attention
